Where the rivers Trent and Ooze join the Humber lays an expanse of wetland, Alkborough Flats, a habitat where migrant visitors mingle and feast alongside residents. In Alkborough Flats, 178 miles north of the RGS, artists Kerry Morrison and Helmut Lemke are exploring the tidal wetland in all its winter glory, occasionally taking refuge from the cold in the Wetland on Wheels van. Daily, Kerry and Helmut will live stream their encounters, interventions, views and thoughts into the gallery. Take a seat, put your feet up, and join them, virtually.
